Mental Health, Isolation and Lockdowns

It is not going to be easy – make sure that you stay in touch by phone or the internet. Show you have not forgotten elderly and vulnerable people....don't feel you have to offer helpful advice if you don't really know what would help just listening attentively to what other people are going through and not invalidating their feelings will help.

Since an increasingly large number of people are self isolating voluntarily or in enforced "lockdowns" around the world it is important to understand what that means for peoples' mental health. The longer this crisis lasts, and the more people are obliged to isolate themselves, the greater the mental health impact across society will be.

I used to work in the UK voluntary sector mental health services as a "development worker" — developing projects and activities for people with mental health issues. I got into this role and job because in the late 1970s and 1980s I had mental health problems. This led me to think a lot about what was happening when I had mental health crises. I thought too about the mental health crises of others. Over time I arrived at an interpretation of mental health problems in which isolation, solitude, and loneliness played an important part.

In the ordinary way of thinking people with mental health problems are typically on their own because of their mental health problems – but I began to think that it made as much sense, indeed more, to interpret things the other way round. In other words not that people are on their own because they are mad – but that they are mad because they are on their own. This was particularly true if they were in a state that I described as "confrontational isolation". In other words where someone falls out with everyone in their social network. Even if one has not fallen out with everyone, to be isolated, and in a state of high negative emotion, is dangerous for mental health.

How difficult it is to be isolated day to day will depend a lot on how many resources we have in our environment. People who are homeless are most vulnerable of all and cannot self isolate.

Isolation undermines realitychecking so that fantasy thinking flourishes

If they are isolated people cannot easily "reality check" things that are important to them – like, for example, what other people are thinking, feeling and doing. For example, if you are on your own and you feel vulnerable it is easy to be paranoid and afraid and you have no way of knowing if you are in danger or not. Such a state of affairs inclines to emotionally charged fantasy. The point here is that without communication what is really going on with and for the other people in your life is inevitably a guess. They may have totally forgotten you. They may be coming to get you. They may be worried for you. You don't know. You are in the dark. Isolation = vulnerability + uncertainty and you may endlessly speculate in hopeful or fearful thinking about what is going on.

That can make "lockdowns" so psychologically challenging. We have radio, TV and the internet. We have telephones. So we can still maintain media-ted contact with each other. Nevertheless isolation is emotionally tough.



Hello fellow humanists,

Here's the facts as I know them via professional sources to date with regard to the current discussion:

From all that is known at this point in the infectious disease (pathology) world-wide community, food safety experts/researchers at the prestigious universities worldwide as well as their related governmental experts agree this novel coronavirus (SARS-COV-2) is like the other 6 known types with respect not infecting via food-borne ingestion which is in contradistinction to the infamous norovirus and rotavirus families (ex. -cruise ships food services). There has never been a documented food-borne case in the corona family. The coronavirus is designed to attach to and penetrate exclusively through the upper airway (mouth/nose) and lower airways' (bronchi/ bronchioles/alveoli) intact (i.e., no wound needed) mucous membrane linings AND

Coli, certain viruses, etc. If after handling the food or fomite (the surface capable of transmitting an infectious organism whether it be glass, clothing, metals, packaging materials) your hands then touch, with a sufficient viral load (number of active viral particles aka virions) you are likely to become infected besides via respiratory droplets (cough, sneeze up close and personal) or the more insidious microscopic aerosol (mist) within the 6 foot

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perimeter. (instead of 'gorillas in the midst' it's coronavirus or think Peanuts' character Pigpen)

I will keep daily monitoring all of the medical/dental/nursing professional journals via my emeritus medical library privileges at Tufts University and free access to all of Elsevier publishing company's product portfolio via my editorial review board privileges) and will update you if something different than the above is published particularly with respect to food handling and consumption.

Now add the fear that we, and loved ones, may get infected and may die. To remain sane we have to watch the news to stay in touch with what is happening – but what emotions occur when we go on twitter and see a convoy of ten Italian army heavy trucks carrying coffins to a crematorium?

The point here is that our thinking can get driven by powerful emotions while on our own when confronted by the awful reality of this pandemic. Thoughts that are fearful about the worst that might happen. Thoughts that are swept along by a powerful sense of our own helplessness.

Mental states that may flourish in emotionally charged isolation

Such mental states may then evoke (a) an inability to concentrate on meaningful activities, a state of distractedness and/or wandering off mentally into reassuring day dreams; (b) mental flashbacks about earlier events in life where one felt powerless and afraid because one did not understand what was going on and was too young to act (regression) (c) noticing the contents of one's own mind as an internal monologue – powerfully charged with emotion (hearing voices – perhaps with different voices for different emotions and situations).

It is not just powerful fear that may drive our thoughts – anger and hope may too – but in ways that are unrealistic and unverifiable. The point about isolation is that one has neither the time nor the contacts and ability to check the truth of our own emotion driven thought processes.

For example it is quite natural in the time of the coronavirus to have strong political opinions about how the crisis has been and should be managed – indignation and anger may be fully justified if and when situations are mismanaged by officials or politicians.

BUT...how does one know why they do what they do – is it malevolence, is it incompetence, are they overwhelmed or have we misinterpreted them totally? Or have the politicians misinterpreted us. They speak about us panicking but is this so? We are accused of stripping the shelves bare of loo rolls but if you have a big family and there is to be two months lock down or longer is the problem that there are not enough loo rolls available on the shelves? Are we being kept in the dark so that we do not panic? If so maybe they are creating a panic because fears flourish where there is a lack of knowledge. Are "they" treating us like children as one public health expert has alleged. Are they assuming that they know best and condescending us like the patricians they regard themselves as being? Many of these questions are unanswerable from the information available but add to the confusion and is a source of anxiety and turmoil in its own right.

Paradoxically even our hope can sometimes be a problem. You may ask: how could hope be a problem? The poet T.S.Elliot writes in his poem East Coker

I said to my soul, be still, and wait without hope For hope would be hope for the wrong thing; wait without love, For love would be love of the wrong thing...

Some of us are hoping for a salvation in which we are the saviour – our vulnerability, our terror and powerlessness is too much to bear so in our day dreams we turn the powerlessness upside down and become a someone. We become fantastically important superstars…like Donald Trump who has the answer for everything and is doing an absolutely fantastic job…or making it up as he goes along and totally unable to be objective.

This is particularly because Trump and Johson is surrounded by institutions that Continued on page 5

World Humanist Congress News

As we continue to track information from the World Health Organization (WHO), the United States' Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), and government agencies regarding public health guidelines and travel advisories, we take seriously the growing urgency to make a decision about whether the Congress will continue.

We are still evaluating whether or not to cancel the Congress, but it is increasingly likely that we will have to do so.

At this time, we recommend that you DO NOT book airline travel or hotel rooms for the Congress until further notice.

Hotel rooms that you have already reserved at the Hyatt Regency Miami may be cancelled up to 48 hours prior to scheduled check-in without penalty. (Accommodations you may have reserved elsewhere are subject to the cancellation rules you agreed to at the time of reservation.)

We will issue notifications immediately when a final decision is made regarding the status of the Congress. If the event is cancelled registration fees will be refunded (minus a processing fee of \$50).

are obsessed by retaining their power and credibility by being seen to make the "right decisions". They also feel the need to redirect everyone's fear, anger and indignation onto someone else to make sure that it is not directed at them — in a time of crisis there is competition for who is to play the role of scapegoat.

Scapegoating

Vulnerable people can become scapegoats too. Vulnerable people live lives where they are frequently ignored by petty officials and/ or may be persecuted by them. The emotional state of neediness by vulnerable people may lead them to insistent claims for help and attention that others, who are themselves overwhelmed by the same crisis, find a distraction adding to the unbearable pressure. In the end the decision makers unload their anger and desperation with an attack on the needy people that will not leave them with any space. "Look we have to operate a triage and you are in the third stream – will someone lock this person away."

Mostly scapegoats are weak and vulnerable people. The anger and desperation generated by a crisis cannot usually be directed at people more powerful than yourself. That would be dangerous — they may remember and later take revenge. So powerful negative emotions are re-directed downwards and reasons are found to justify and rationalize the persecution. People find themselves doing ugly things. Then they must do those things again...and again...Then they cut themselves off from what they are doing. Then they start to enjoy what they are doing because it makes them feel powerful. It gives them a sense of agency in a time of chaos as they take away the agency of others. To justify doing it they demonize the one's they are persecuting and tell themselves that their cruelty is for their own good, for the good of everyone.

Yet in this case vulnerable people are likely to be sources of infection because they do not have the means to protect themselves and in their extreme vulnerability are likely to become erratic, distracted at too many conflicting demands on them. This renders their lives unmanageable because they have no where of their own to keep themselves separate and manage personal hygiene.

These remarks extend to prisoners who are kept in conditions that are optimal for the spread of disease – including spreading it to prison warders and other staff.

Contrasting the isolated to the 'well connected'

There is an irony here. While the most vulnerable in our society like homeless people and prisoners are unable to protect themselves by keeping themselves apart – this is also true, with this disease, of the ruling elite.

If you study how the elite keep and exercise their power it is not only by using the fabulous amount of money that they have, the "purchasing power", it is also by using their "well connectedness"

To be a part of the ruling elite you must be very intensively networked. A host of institutions exist to ensure that powerful people in one field – finance, energy, media, military and military industrial complex, manufacturing, academia – are able to easily







TBS's "\$1,000 Challenge" -- Since 1989, Tampa Bay Skeptics has been offering its "\$1,000 Challenge" to anyone claiming the ability to demonstrate any paranormal phenomenon to us under mutually agreed-upon conditions that are properly controlled so as to eliminate the possibility of success by cheating or other non-paranormal means.

Though not always possible due to the nature of the claimed paranormal ability, TBS prefers a "Challenge" structured so that the mathematical probability of a successful demonstration can be calculated -- such as determining the next coin flip, the suit of the next card in a deck, or whether the next box contains an object (supplied by the claimant) or is empty. This eliminates the need for one or more judges to subjectively opine as to whether or not the claimant has successfully fulfilled the requirements of the official test protocol, which is signed in advance by TBS's representatives and the claimant. Our required degree of difficulty of approximately 1:1,000,000 by chance guesswork (equivalent to 20 consecutive correct coin flips) is the generally accepted standard around the world for such testing.

None of the dozen or so claimants so far has succeeded, but should one someday prevail, not only would TBS's \$1,000 be awarded, but the claimant would be automatically eligible to perform a comparable test for groups offering even greater rewards, such as the California-based Independent Investigation Group's (IIG) \$50,000 prize.





The Trouble with





Southern Baptists

Southern Baptists have always been reactionary. Indeed, they were founded primarily to defend slavery. They have always been staunchly patriarchal and insistent that only certain Protestants can get into Heaven. Many of them have been anti-Jewish.

This last flaw has not turned off many Israelis. Southern Baptists were on hand to celebrate President Trump's provocative move of the US embassy to Jerusalem. Southern Baptist preachers even delivered sectarian prayers for the occasion.

Southern Baptists believe that the U.S. has a central role in biblical prophecy, even though the name "America" appears nowhere in the so-called good book. Many Christians simply use highly imaginative "thinking" and retrofitting to come to the conclusion that the U.S. is highly favored by God. These religious fanatics believe that the modern state of Israel will figure prominently in Christian eschatology. They believe that Israel will be at the center of the "war to end all wars," and that certain Christians will be raptured to Heaven. (Pat Robertson once even reportedly planned to film the Rapture!)

Israeli leaders seem to know that these Christian bigots do not like them or trust them. However, many Israelis seem to believe they simply have differences in theology. Many Israelis believe that reactionary Christians in the U.S. are among their best allies, and that dangerous anti-Semitism among reactionary Christians is a thing of the past.

The problem with the religious insanity of Southern Baptists is that it is *dangerous*! They are actually looking forward to World War III and they will do whatever they can to accelerate it. And in Trump they have the perfect dupe to do their bidding. Who cares how many porn stars he sleeps with as long as he can help usher in the Second Coming of Jesus Christ?

Pastor Rick Wiles is especially off-the-wall. He is constantly featured on Right Wing Watch. He has stated that Muslims must be "stomped out like cockroaches." He believes Obama is truly a demon from the pits of Hell.

(However, the pastor has reportedly fallen out with Trump, and in 2017, he said that Ivanka Trump is an evil woman that practices Kabbala.)

Recently, Wiles said that antichrist refers to behavior and beliefs. He said that anyone who disbelieves that Jesus was God in human form "is antichrist." He included Jews, Hindus, Buddhists, Muslims and others.

Israelis might also be interested to know that Wiles condemns homosexuality and Zionism and says that "They're driven by the same spirit." He believes that homosexuality and Zionism will rule the world simultaneously through Artificial Intelligence and high-tech surveillance of the people. This paranoid conspiracy theorist further believes that the evil figure of the Antichrist will be a homosexual Jew. (Homosexuals and Jews are, not coincidentally, despised by many Southern Baptists.)

Many Southern Baptists believe that the Antichrist will be a Jew. There is no telling how geopolitics will play out. But how could such a belief possibly bode well for Jews, especially Israelis?

White Baptist leaders are not the only ones with controversial religious beliefs. The Reverend Michael R. Jordan, pastor of the New Era Baptist Church in Birmingham, Alabama, recently put up a sign saying "Black Folks Need to Stay Out of White Churches." This was in reaction to a White church, the Church of the Highlands, opening a new branch, headed by a Black pastor, in Jordan's Black community. Jordan has had other provocative signs with messages such as "AIDS is God's Curse on a Homosexual Lifestyle" and "White Folks Refused to Be Our Neighbors."

In 2017, a White Reverend, Chris Ashley, put up a sign at his Cowan Road Baptist Church in Gulfport Mississippi that said "Allah is Satan." He has refused to back down. And so it goes.

Despite all of this bigoted nonsense, the main stimulus for this article is the latest Southern Baptist outrage. The Reverend Grady Arnold of Cuero, Texas has stated that social justice, racial justice and global justice are evil. He has sided with Southern Baptist leader Paige Patterson, who has angered many by apparently viewing women as sex objects and implying that women in abusive relationships should stay and try to work it out. Ashley grumbled, "This social justice is creeping down into local churches. If we start down this road, where will it end?"

White Southern Baptists here are speaking the same language as White non-theists that constantly bash Social Justice Warriors (SJWs). It is this kind of bigoted mindset that demonstrates how race trumps everything. White non-theists that oppose social justice are much more likely to join forces with religious Whites of a like mind, than they are to join forces with Black non-theists, most of whom believe in social justice.

Once again, Southern Baptists are taking a lead in defense of reactionary ideas. Anyone who gives aid and comfort to such religionists is no friend of genuine progress.


