## Civil Liberties and Civil Rights

The foundation on which Civilization & Humanism is built. With **Nigel Watson** of the Pinellas Chapter of the ACLU



For over eighty years, the American Civil Liberties Union has organized a stout defense of our constitution and its guarantees of civil liberty. During all this time it has neither sought nor received government approval.

Rather, it is an organization of citizens seeking to ensure the public good and the stability of our democratic institutions through judicial and legislative relief from the attempts of the few to subvert the inherent rights of the many in order to secure cultural or political hegemony in the nation.

Because of the dynamic nature of the political enterprise, this is an ongoing process; for as long as people question (as they should) every aspect of governance. The purpose of the constitution and it's accompanying bill of rights is solely to ensure the order and democratic nature of change. The ACLU and similar organizations are the guardians of this constitution. It both defends and explains it in order to popularize it in the public understanding, so that we may continue to resist the enthusiasms of momentary extremism, and the "madness of crowds."

Ironically, though the ACLU has received vast support from the liberal part of the spectrum, it is very much a conservative institution. But only in the best, most accurate sense of that word.

It is especially pleasing to report that four of our members currently serve on the Pinellas County board: Glenn Paul, Jerry Moore, Bob Collette, and Jim Peterson.
