Who are we, anyway? That is, who's thrown into that possibly useful social construct, "The American People?" Could it actually be all of us?

Unfortunately, if you listen to the politically wistful Wall Street Journal columnist, Reagan-woozy Peggy Noonan, "The American People" seem somehow to be merely those particular Americans who think along her lines -- a Pollyannaish texturing of rightwing delusion.

Amazingly, for the megaphonic Ed Schultz of the MSNBC "Ed Show," "The American People" just coincidentally have a train of thought that runs on the same tracks as his own runaway train of do-gooder, antiplutocrat programs from wild-eyed liberals.

If you listen to (or read) such mumbly-minded cud regurgitators as David Broder, radiating a vague content with the status quo or the conventional wisdom (not always the same), whatever shape-shift either may take on a given date, it's those people, like him who can't envision what isn't placed directly in front of them.

Well, I'm one of those American people of a mind with Ed Schultz most of the time. My liberalism is sometimes wild-eyed, other times only reasonable but resolute. Nevertheless, in no way would I contend that my views necessarily reflect those of "The American People." They reflect only the attitudes of a chunk of us, sometimes large, sometimes not so much.

Now Ed, on each program, takes a poll of his viewers. He asks them to text-message him in favor of one of two opposing attitudes toward some issue or program in the current political discussion. One position is nominally "progressive" and the other nominally "conservative" (essentially this vies Noonan's "American People" against Ed's "American People." Since Ed's viewers are overwhelmingly in the liberal/progressive fold it should be no surprise that the results are usually something between 85% to 95% in favor of Ed's own position (a similar poll of a Fox News audience would produce a contradictory "voice of the people").

Yet Ed takes the results of these polls as the voice of... (you guessed it) "The American People."

Certainly the results express the political sympathies of <u>some</u> American people, but those of <u>the</u> American people (that is to say a substantial majority)? The latter I consider so unlikely as an across-the-board result applied to any and every issue that Ed presents that the man himself lives, in this fragment of his life, in delusion.

Likewise, Noonan and Broder (and many others) are equally selective in their sources of information and "facts."

Akin to this politically/culturally narcissistic view of "The American People," is the slightly more modest but similarly self-serving claim that "the mainstream" or "mainstream thinking" is or reflects the particular "stream" the speaker swims in.

As an afterthought, we may still be holding on to something like "We the People" as a concept, although we may be swimming upstream against the tide of "folks." Conceive "We the Folks do hereby," "Folks for the American Way," "Folks to Folks" diplomatic outreach, "in this election the folks have spoken," or "the folks have the last voice in our American system." Obama is popularizing the substitution of "folks" for who knows whom in a flood of references in speeches and informal comments. I hope he doesn't chase "people" away. "Folks" has its appropriate uses, but as the representation of a political or social entity it has a dreadful implication: that of the fascist organic state, for instance that of the "Deutschevolk."

In other words, "people" implies a collection of individuals, "folk" an organic mass.
