## Will Violence fade away?

Stephen Pinker\* has written that interpersonal and even state violence has greatly diminished in the past century. We are all too well aware that terrible things happen arising from human causes. In the last century, wars, crimes, pogroms, massacres, as well as the more subtle and muted violence of interpersonal belligerence, animosity, competitive business decisions, prejudice and discrimination of many kinds are the stuff of everyday news.

But could it be that despite the apparent human chaos being brought before us everyday, that the level of violent behavior has measurably receded from what it was?

Certainly the Bible testifies to the widespread, nearly continuous state of war in which the relatively primitive tribes of the time were engaged. This is further verified by many other written accounts of the time. And from there, we know of the existence of states of warfare between thousands of fiefdoms; conditions that were characteristic of all the "civilizations" of the time, leading right up to the present.

Are we hopelessly entangled in skein of conflict, fear, and homicidal rage on a mass scale? Or will humankind find its way in time?



## Take Action: Tell Congress To Oppose Funding For Abstinence-Only Education!

Congress will soon introduce an appropriations bill that funds the federal government through the end of Fiscal Year 2012. **Unfortunately, this bill** 

contains a \$5 million earmark that would revive funding for obsolete abstinence-only-until-marriage programs.


This earmark contradicts the budget cutting message Congress constantly pushes on the American people. It is upsetting that politicians would decide to once again to waste taxpayers' money by funding the now-defunct Community-Based Abstinence Education (CBAE) grant program that decades of research has shown to have no effect on teen behavior.

The removal of abstinence-only funding and the focus on comprehensive sexual education programs has greatly improved sexual health among American teens and has prepared them for a lifetime of responsible decision making. A reversion back to ineffective sexual education programs such as the abstinence-only program endangers our youth and hinders our nation's ability to promote a responsible and comprehensive sexual education program.

Contact your Representatives and Senators right now and stand with the American Humanist Association in opposing funding for ineffective abstinence-only education programs

The American Humanist Association supports sexual education programs that are based in a scientific understanding of the body and a realistic approach towards youth behavior. For Several Years the Ethical Humanist Society of Long Island has celebrated Darwin Day on or around February 12 (Charles Darwin's birthday). Last year's Darwin Day/Stand Up For Science Day was our best yet. Dr. Victor Schuster gave a wonderful demonstration of the scientific method during his platform talk. He posed a situation that also included an ethical problem and he elicited audience participation in solving the dilemma. During his entire presentation, Dr. Schuster reminded us how we were employing the scientific method: Observing, identifying a problem, forming a hypothesis, and testing for consistency or reformulating the hypothesis. We enjoyed his presentation so much that we have invited him back to join us this year, when February 12 falls on Sunday, our regularly scheduled platform day.

What makes our annual celebration unique is that it is conducted as an intergenerational event sponsored by our Sunday morning secular children's program called Kids In Deed (KID). Everyone at the Ethical Humanist Society of Long Island enjoys participating or watching other members engaged in the hands-on activities. One of our members, a biology professor and parent active in our children's program, came up with activities that included dissecting owl pellets to identify what owls eat, extracting DNA from strawberries, and a game called "Predator/Prey B-I-N-G-O."

As a longtime public elementary school teacher, I tried to find an activity that was appropriate and fun for younger kids. I found the "Survival of the Fittest" game online, written as a high school exploration, and rewrote it for children ages five to thirteen.

It surprises me that more secular children's programs haven't embraced Darwin Day, but as I search the Internet, it appears that only colleges and adult organizations have activities.

Here is a niche that our ethical societies and humanist organizations should fill. Children are inquisitive by nature, so science lends itself to countless hands-on learning activities for children of all ages. Parents should feel comfortable allowing their children to participate in these activities because it increases their academic skills and involvement in a variety of ways. #### Why are we doing this?

Across America, in every city, every town, and every school, secularism is on the rise. Whether people call themselves atheists, agnostics, secular Humanists, or any of the other terms used to describe their god-free lifestyle, secularism is coming out of the closet. According to the 2008 American Religious Identification Survey (PDF), the percentage of people with no religious affiliation grew in all fifty states. Humanist Society members, *Ron Frase, Jim Peterson*, *Matt Cooper*, and *Luke Melton* are planning the curriculum for this initial three week course. It will take place at the USF Tampa Campus. Expert guidance, AV technology, and interactive devices will supplement the learning environment. Our subject matter will encompass the full range of likely social, economic, and natural problems that will engage the attention of people in the rapidly emerging future. At this point, the constraint of time imposed by campus logistics will prevent us from having the more full ranging discussion that is needed by many of these subjects, but we will try to hit the most salient aspects of each area. The next time we do this, we hoe to have 6 to 8 weeks to more fully unpack the more significant aspects of how these problems might impact our civilization.

These will affect all aspects of our lives including housing, transportation, work, the natural environment, and our relations with each other. See future issues for more.

This is yet another opportunity to bring attention to the problems and opportunities we will have in the future. The philosophical perspective of humanism can make a significant contribution to that transition.

Senators Patrick Leahy (D- VT) and Mike Crapo (R-ID) have recently introduced a bipartisan bill, S. 1925, to reauthorize and improve the Violence Against Women Act.

The passage of the original Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) in 1994 was a giant step forward for our nation. Domestic violence, sexual assault, dating violence and stalking are pervasive issues throughout the United States. VAWA meant that our federal government formally acknowledged that domestic and sexual violence cause tremendous harm, and therefore put resources into helping victims and responding to these crimes. Our nation and millions of individuals are safer as a result.

The time has come to again reauthorize this critical legislation. The Violence Against Women Act of 2011 will build upon efforts to prevent violence before it begins and teach the next generation that violence is always wrong. Congress must reauthorize this legislation to address this and build healthy communities.

Stand with the AHA in supporting this important piece of legislation today.

The American Humanist Association affirms the fundamental nature of a person's right to be free from violence. As such, we believe that Congress has a duty to pass legislation like VAWA which protects our fellow citizens from violent aggressors. Dear ACLU Supporters,

Earlier today, in a big victory for privacy rights, the Supreme Court ruled in U.S. v. Jones that the government violated the Fourth Amendment when it attached a GPS device to Antoine Jones's car and tracked his movements continuously for a month without a warrant. The ACLU filed an amicus in the case.

This was a critical decision for defending the Fourth Amendment, which protects Americans from unreasonable searches. But even more significant, this was the first time in 20 years, the Supreme Court has had to consider the constitutionality of location-tracking technology.

As the court made clear, attaching a GPS device to a car and tracking its movements implicates the Fourth Amendment. Unfortunately, the government is likely to persist in arguing that the decision does not apply to tracking the location of cell phones.

Tell Congress: The government can't use our cell phones as tracking devices without a warrant. From GPS tracking to wireless surveillance, the ACLU is making sure your rights are protected and your privacy is respected.

Today was a big first victory. Now, we need to keep pushing for better privacy laws.
