Political Season reveals retreat of Enlightenment

We are witnessing an epochal shift in our socio-political world. We are de-evolving, hurtling headlong into a past that was defined by serfs and lords; by necromancy and superstition; by policies based on fiat, not facts. Much of what has made the modern world in general, and the United States in particular, a free and prosperous society comes directly from insights that arose during the Enlightenment. Too bad we're chucking it all out and returning to the Dark Ages. Literally. Two main things distinguished the post Enlightenment world from the pre Enlightenment Dark Ages.

First, Francis Bacon's *Novo Organum Scientiarum (The New Instrument of Science)* introduced a new way of understanding the world, in which empiricism, facts and ... well ... reality ... defined what was *real*. It essentially outlined the scientific method: observation and data collection, formulation of hypotheses, experiments designed to test hypotheses and elevation of these hypotheses to theories when data consistently supported them. It was and is a system based on skepticism, and a relentless and methodical search for truth.

It brought us advances and untold wealth and health. From one-horse carts to automobiles to airplanes. From leeches and phrenology to penicillin and monoclonal antibodies. Until recently.

Now, we seek to operate by revealed truths, not reality. Decrees from on high – often issued by an unholy alliance of religious fundamentalists, self-interested corporations, and greedy fat cats – are offered up as reality by rightwing politicians.

For example, North Carolina law-makers recently passed legislation [against sea level rise](#). A day later, the Virginia legislature required that references to global warming, climate change and [sea level rise](#) [be excised](#) from a proposed study on [sea level rise](#). Last year, the Texas Department of Environmental Quality, which had commissioned a study on Galveston Bay, cut all references to sea level rise – the main point of the study. We are, indeed, at an epochal threshold.

As Stephen Colbert so aptly put it: [if your science gives you results you don't like, pass a law saying that the result is illegal. Problem solved.](#) Except it isn't. Wishing reality away, doesn't make it go away. Pretending that the unreal is real doesn't make it real.

And the descent into the Dark Ages is marked by more than global warming. Take austerity budgets. There is [an extensive historical record showing that implementing austerity measures in an economic slowdown is counter productive](#). And this data is backed up by current experience in Europe, [where austerity measures have been disastrous](#). So the data is telling us austerity during a jobs crisis hasn't worked in the past and isn't working now. What to do? [Pass an austerity budget](#), of course.

Welcome to the Dark Ages.

The litany of ignorance goes on and on. Teach Creationism. Teach the “controversy” on climate science and intelligent design. Declare deregulation – which was a primary cause of the 2008 economic collapse – to be the solution to it. Preach trickle down economics, even after it has failed every time it's been adopted; even as we watch wealth rocket up the income brackets. What's next? Give the flat-earthers a say. Oh hell, why stop there. Let's put Earth back in the center of the solar system where it belongs.



The five policy resolution adopted at our last meeting were:

1) Restrain ourselves from **gratuitous attacks on religion and religious belief systems**. An exception is made for situations that are clearly injurious. We will strive for respectful dialogue.

2) Governments should **emphasize economic growth over austerity programs**. The political push for austerity has been used as an excuse to dismantle social welfare programs. Tom Friedman has written extensively on this issue. The economic pain should be commensurate with the size of benefits received during the prior economic expansion. Raise taxes on those who have had out-sized benefits and can obviously afford to contribute proportionately more.)
15 in favor 2 opposed

3) Invigorate efforts to preserve **separation of church and state**.
19 in favor 1 opposed

4) We should firmly stand in **opposition to any attempt at voter suppression**.
20 in favor 0 opposed

5) One response to the concern over probable/inevitable human **over-population** is to strongly promote and make available, in the U.S. and globally, the use of birth-control. Related to this is the oppression of women in male-centric cultures.
20 in favor 0 opposed *JG*

First, we don't need no stinkin' science. We don't need no pesky reality. We just gotta pass a few laws and declare things to be the way we want them to be, facts be damned. You know, keep your government hands off my Medicare.

Second, the Enlightenment laid the groundwork for our form of government. *The Social Contract* is the intellectual basis of all modern democratic republics, including ours. John Locke and others argued that governments derived their authority from the governed, not from divine right. Governments could be legitimate, then, only with the consent of the governed.

Jefferson acknowledged Locke's influence on the *Declaration of Independence* and his ideas are evident in the Constitution.

Here again, our founders used reason, empiricism and academic scholarship to cobble together one of the most enduring and influential documents in human history. For all its flaws, it has steered us steadily toward a more perfect union. Until recently.

Now, reason, empiricism and scholarship are the punch line to right wing jokes and jihads. Santorum captured the Tea Party's hostility to these Enlightenment virtues when he [likened a college education to an indoctrination](#). Thankfully, Santorum is gone, but the embrace of ignorance he advocated lives on. And so corporations are now accorded the rights of citizenship. Power, once again, is meted out by birthright, not inalienable right. By possession of wealth, not by justice or equity or merit. So what?

Well, the US now has the same income inequality as [Cameroon](#), [Uganda](#) and [Rwanda](#), and we're trapped in this pathetic state – [income mobility in the US lags behind most other developed nations](#).

In short, Horatio Alger is dead, long live Exxon.

We are, indeed, at an epochal threshold. We can continue to discard the Enlightenment values which enabled both an untold increase in material wealth and a system of government which turned serfs into citizens. A system which – for all its flaws – often managed to protect the rights of the many, against the predatory power of the few. Or we can continue our abject surrender to myths, magical thinking, and self-delusion and the Medieval nation-state those forces are resurrecting.

Republicans and Tea Partiers may be leading this retreat from reason, but they are unopposed by Democrats or the Press. And in the end, there is a special place in Hell for those who allow evil to prosper by doing nothing.

Civil liberties news in the Sunshine State

It probably comes as no surprise that Florida is ground zero in the nationwide fight over voter suppression. And the ACLU has been right in the middle of it.

When they passed a law making voter registration next to impossible here in Florida, we (along with the Brennan Center) went to court on behalf of the League of Women Voters and other groups and won.

Now they're trying to purge hundreds, possibly thousands of rightfully-registered voters off the rolls — and we (along with the Lawyers Committee for Civil Rights Under Law) filed a lawsuit to prevent it.

Governor Rick Scott just won't quit. He's bound and determined to block the vote in Florida — especially for minority voters.

Tell Governor Scott the ACLU is on alert and won't let him derail or deny anyone's voting rights.

The ACLU is fighting tooth and nail all across the country to protect people's right to vote. And we won't stop fighting — not here in Florida, not anywhere.

Florida is a key battleground in our effort to make sure people aren't denied this most fundamental freedom. Let's make it clear we won't let any attack against that fundamental right go unanswered.

Act now. Tell Governor Scott that we won't stand for any voter suppression ploys.

We know when we stand together we can make a difference. But they are going to throw everything they've got at us in the six months leading up to Election Day. With your help, I'm confident that whenever and wherever people's right to vote is put in jeopardy, the ACLU will be there — protecting the right to vote and the Voting Rights Act that people fought so hard for almost 50 years ago.

Why no Solar Power for the Sunshine State?

Ask state lawmakers why Florida doesn't focus more on solar energy and they'll complain about too many clouds.

So with little political will to aggressively tap the sun, Florida now lags behind other not-as-sunny places such as Massachusetts, Ohio, New York and New Jersey in developing more solar capacity. New Jersey installed the most new solar in the first quarter of 2012, according to a report released Wednesday by the Solar Energy Industries Association. Florida ranked 14th.

The difference was huge. New Jersey added almost 174 megawatts from January to March. At that rate, the state would add the equivalent of a mid-sized nuclear reactor to its electrical capacity by the end of the year. Florida added just 2.8 megawatts.

Why is the Sunshine State falling behind in development of solar electricity? Several reasons.

The primary one, experts say, is a lack of a state requirement or even a goal for increasing the amount of solar electricity. James Fenton, director of the Florida Solar Energy Center at the University of Central Florida, put it this way: "Florida itself does not have a vision for its future. That's true on everything in Florida, but particularly in regard to energy."

In 2006, former Gov. Charlie Crist pushed for a policy that would have required 20 percent of the state's energy to come from renewable energy sources by 2020, but that effort died.

State lawmakers scuttled the idea, saying Florida's "intermittent cloud cover," or essentially clouds that come and go, would disrupt solar power generation and make it unreliable. It's a claim lawmakers echo today.

"I heard that for 10 years ... intermittent cloud cover," said Susan Glickman, a lobbyist for the environmental group Southern Alliance for Clean Energy. "A good number of states have set targets for renewable energy and that helps to create a market where renewable energy can thrive and Florida policy makers have not done that."







NOW is a multi-issue political organization. NOW's self-defined role has been to initiate change for the benefit of the greatest number of people, to affect the legal and institutional structures of the society in a way that systematically expands the choices and possibilities available to all women. In this way, NOW takes action to bring women, as a class, into the mainstream of society, rather than offering aid to individual women in achieving personal solutions or temporary relief from oppression.

The Florida National Organization for Women (NOW) is in strong opposition to the Personhood Amendment ballot initiative for which the organization Personhood Florida is currently collecting signatures, according to Florida NOW president Donna Slutiak. "This amendment is ridiculous and an insult to women," Slutiak said. "The issue of Personhood would have very far reaching results, and would do more than criminalize abortion; it would also make birth control pills and the IUD illegal in the state of Florida. The amendment states that human life begins at the time when an egg is fertilized, which will also impact in-vitro-fertilization clinics. How would you like your mother's fertilized eggs that are sitting in a clinic freezer to have inheritance rights? Do you want to have to go underground to get your birth control pills?" Florida NOW expects all intelligent people to pledge not to sign this initiative, and to vote against it, if by some fluke it does get on the ballot. Personhood is bad for womanhood.



Excluding Women from the Florida Constitution


Article 1 section 23 of the Florida Constitution states that "Every natural person has the right to be let alone and free from governmental intrusion into the person's private life." Why does the Florida legislature want to remove women from this very critical right?

As HJR 1179 made its way through the state Legislature this session, the bill was presented as a way to restrict public funding of abortion — which is already illegal and has been for three decades. The bill morphed into Amendment 6 on the 2012 ballot titled "Florida Abortion". But one of the underplayed consequences is that it would also roll back a constitutional privacy right in the Florida Constitution, which currently provides more protection for women than the U.S. Constitution does.

Just as important to know about is the Florida legislative 2012 ballot initiative: Florida Religious Freedom, Amendment 8. Find out what you can do to help educate Floridians on the dangers of this amendment to our civil society. The proposed measure would prevent individuals from being barred from participating in public programs if they choose to use public funds at a religious provider.

In 2004, TBS became a Special Interest Group of the [Center For Inquiry–Tampa Bay](#).

Particular areas of interest to TBS include **UFOs**, **"psychic" power**, **astrology**, **fringe science & medicine**, purported **miracles** and other **New Age** claims. Our interest in religion is restricted to claims that can be objectively tested and potentially verified, such as "weeping icons" or miraculous healings.

TBS conducts its own investigations, follows the activities of other skeptics groups, monitors the press coverage of the paranormal, and publishes a quarterly newsletter, [Tampa Bay Skeptics Report](#), which is also distributed gratis to members of the press and to many other skeptics groups around the world. TBS also makes its representatives available to local and national media to provide a skeptical voice as a counterweight to the irrationalism and superstition that is increasingly prevalent in the television and print media.

TBS does not reject claims out of hand, but rather is committed to objective and critical inquiry. In this vein, we share the philosophy of the Committee for Skeptical Inquiry ([CSI](#)) -- publisher of [Skeptical Inquirer](#) magazine, an international organization that has nurtured the growth of local skeptics groups (such as ours) all over the world.

TBS's "\$1,000 Challenge"

Whenever possible, TBS attempts to put claims to the test. Since 1989 we have had a standing [\\$1,000 Challenge](#) available to anyone able to provide TBS with verifiable scientific proof of any paranormal phenomenon. No one has yet succeeded, but we remain open-minded (though highly skeptical) and desirous of subjecting testable paranormal claims to objective scrutiny. Should anyone ever succeed in a test for TBS, we will arrange for a test by the James Randi Educational Foundation for its [\\$1,000,000 Challenge](#).



Nontheists are a large minority, larger than many minorities having much more political and cultural influence than we do. Based on the US Census Bureau estimate of Florida's 2008 population and several polls, we estimate our statewide constituency at about 2,800,000 residents (more than 400,000 in the Tampa Bay quad-county area). Tampa Bay CoR has organized to increase our standing in the marketplace of ideas and to take our rightful place at the table of acceptance and equal rights. We invite all nontheists to support us in our efforts.

Even if you never join a group or attend a meeting you can help Florida move forward by contributing to local or national participating organizations. And you can always help to further the nontheistic community just by standing up proudly for your reality-based life among your friends and family. It's OK to not believe in gods.
