Fighting for Equality Washington, D.C., April 24, 2018)—Today the

American Humanist Association (AHA) filed an amicus brief with the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit in support of a lower court ruling that declared that excluding atheists and Humanists from legislative invocation practices violates both the U.S. and Florida Constitutions. Two Humanist Society Celebrants, Keith Becher and David Williamson, are plaintiffs in the case. Both are also leaders of local AHA groups in Florida.

In October, 2017, the U.S. District Court for the Middle District of Florida ruled that the Brevard County Florida's Board of County Commissioners invocation policy showed favoritism for certain faiths in direct violation of the Establishment Clause. The AHA brief. endorsed by the Unitarian Universalist Association and the American Ethical Union, argues that the District Court's decision should be upheld.

"Reversal of this sound ruling would contravene decades of binding First Amendment precedent holding that the government cannot prefer some religions over others, and religion over nonreligion," said Monica Miller, Senior Counsel of the AHA's Legal Center. "Moreover, the Supreme Court has specifically declared that Humanism and atheism must be treated as 'religions' for Establishment Clause purposes.'

This brief is filed on the heels of the AHA's recent legal victory in the U.S. District Court of North Carolina, which ruled that the disparate treatment of Humanist inmates violates the Establishment Clause of the First Amendment and Equal Protection Clause of the Fourteenth Amendment.

A Sigmund Freud Film Challenge.


Sunday, May 6, 2018 - 7:30 pm.



We are approaching the sixtieth birthday of ...

The Keeling Curve.

It is such a stunning example of important and clearly presented science that it has been designated as a National Historic Chemical Landmark. Its creator received the highest US award for lifetime achievement in science, the National Medal of Science, "for his pioneering and fundamental research on atmospheric and oceanic carbon dioxide, the basis for understanding global carbon cycle and global warming."

In July 1958, Dr. Charles Keeling of the Scripps Institution of Oceanography began measuring the amount of carbon dioxide (CO₂) in the Earth's atmosphere. Using measuring equipment and techniques he developed, he collected air samples daily from an observatory 3,000 meters above sea level, on the remote north side of the Mauna Loa volcano on Hawaii's Big Island.

He continued doing this until his death in 2005, and his son Ralph, also a climate scientist at Scripps, has continued it since. The result is the world's longest continuous record of atmospheric carbon dioxide. A recent release is shown below.

In his very first annual report, Keeling noted that the level at the end of the first year was higher than it had been 12 months earlier. That proved to be a permanent trend. The amount of $\rm CO_2$ in the air we breathe has risen from 313 parts per million to 421 — a 33% increase. Keeling's work disproved the once common view that oceans and other sinks would prevent $\rm CO_2$ from fossil fuels from accumulating in the atmosphere.

Carbon dioxide is transparent to the part of the electromagnetic spectrum we experience as visible light, but opaque to the part we feel as heat.

As in a greenhouse, sunlight gets in and warms things up, but the heat can't get out. The more CO₂ there is in the atmosphere, the warmer our climate will be.

A 33% increase in 60 years is a serious concern, but it's much worse than it looks. In the 1990s, scientists drilled deep holes in Antarctic's ancient ice — the cores they removed provide an 800,000 year record of atmospheric CO₂ levels. Through all that time, through ice ages and warm spells, the CO₂ level was never higher than 300 parts per million. Greenhouse gas concentrations were already above that when Keeling started work, and they are still going up.

But there is something else of note in the Keeling Curve. Before the steady upward trend was clear, Keeling noticed something unexpected — CO₂ levels rise from October to May and fall from May to October, creating a saw-tooth pattern, shown in red. He was the first person to see the Earth breathing.





Faster than light? Well, not so fast!

In September, physicists at an Italian laboratory reported that they had measured subatomic particles traveling <u>faster</u> than the speed of light. If true, this would violate one of the seemingly unshakable principles in modern physics, first formulated by Einstein, that nothing can travel faster than the speed of light. This universal speed limit has been the bane of science-fiction writers ever since. How can we travel to distant stars if it would take years or centuries for one round trip?

The scientists at the Gran Sasso National Laboratory in Italy performed measurements over the course of three years, timing the speed of neutrinos coming from the CERN facility in Geneva, Switzerland, 730 kilometers away. Traveling at the speed of light, it should have taken 2.43 milliseconds to make the trip, but on average the neutrinos got there 60 nanoseconds sooner than expected. (A nanosecond is one billionth of a second.)

Scientists around the world were befuddled. How can this be? Will we have to rewrite the basic laws of physics? Woo-woo artists everywhere started speculating that knowit-all scientists were getting a comeuppance, and that proof of psychic phenomena will soon follow. Or could this be another "cold fusion" fiasco, a new earth-shattering discovery soon to be discredited?

As it turns out, neither appears to be the case. There is an important lesson to be learned in watching this exciting report unfold. **This is science at its best, not its most ridiculous.**

Notice, first of all, how the discovery was reported. The scientists didn't call a press conference announcing that Einstein had been proven wrong and that a new world of physics had begun. The scientists instead reported their findings at a conference of peers at CERN, and set forth the specific ways in which the experiments had been performed, their attempts to triple-check the results, and the uncertainty they felt existed in their measurements. Rather than making room on their mantles for a Nobel Prize, they instead invited their fellow scientists to duplicate the experiments and find its flaws.

Also notice the reaction of the scientific community when presented with a clear description of how the experiments were performed. They immediately began exploring ways in which the findings might be wrong.

When the media tells us "here is great hope for a cure", why is it usually useless information?

Ways to validate "news" and sources for a reality check:

Skeptical Raptor
Double X Science

Perhaps a systematic error in the experiment gave rise to the anomalous results. Perhaps there was uncertainty in the "cloud of neutrinos" that were under observation. Perhaps an electronic malfunction of some sort occurred. No one threw out their physics books.

Since the initial report, the same laboratory asked CERN to "tighten" the cloud of neutrinos being generated and sent to Italy, in order to further refine the parameters of the experiment. In mid-November, they reported that even with this change in the stream of neutrinos, they measured the same 60-nanosecond-faster-than-light speed. This eliminates one possible source of error. But another group of scientists, pointing out that if the neutrinos had indeed traveled faster than light they would have lost a predictable amount of energy, looked for such loss in energy and found none.

Scientists will continue -- as they should -- looking for additional evidence contrary to the "faster-than-light" hypothesis and trying to figure out what (if anything) is wrong with the original experimental design. If they cannot find such systemic errors, then they will need to begin speculating about the ways in which the theory of special relativity may require revision. Some have even argued that special relativity could allow for such a phenomenon under very limited circumstances. Whatever happens, true scientific findings are falsifiable, and scientific theories are always open to disproof and change. Compare that to a typical psychic claim.

As Carl Sagan said, and we often repeat, "Extraordinary claims require extraordinary proof."



The "Grotesque Caricature" of the White Evangelical is real

Most are apoplectic about the White Evangelical durable and cultlike support for Donald Trump. Some see their current morality as a self-serving new thing to get the judges they want. The evil emanating from their movement is neither new nor should it be surprising.

Hollis Phelps', Professor of Interdisciplinary studies at Mercer University in Macon, GA wrote an <u>article</u> titled "Maybe It's Time to Admit that the 'Grotesque Caricature' of White Evangelicals is the Reality" where he examines the pathology. It is likely the best analysis of the reality of the evil that has always been a part of the sect. He wrote the following.

There's no doubt that evangelicalism seems to have an image problem, especially since its overwhelming alliance with Trump. In the minds of many outside the fold, evangelicalism no longer represents a specific religious position centered on sin and the need for individual salvation but rather a self-serving, power-hungry political movement that will side with the devil himself for the sake of political pragmatism.

"When people say what does it mean to be an evangelical, people don't say evangelism or the gospel," Birdsall told the Washington Post. But this image problem isn't new. Although polling shows that overall feelings toward evangelicals as a religious group have remained relatively stable since 2014, the perception of evangelicals as "agents of intolerance," to quote John McCain back in 2008, well predates the Trump era. And besides, we shouldn't chalk it all up to image. The fact remains that over 80% of self-identified white evangelical voters cast their lot with Trump. Moreover, despite a host of missteps and scandals, overall evangelical support for Trump as president hasn't declined but grown.

Phelps posits the pretext that the White Evangelical uses to support Donald Trump and turns it on its head.

Given the consistency with which white evangelicals as a whole have lent their support to Trump—and right-wing candidates and policies more generally—it's far past time to own up to the fact that the image is, in many respects, the reality.

Well-intentioned evangelical leaders may not like to hear that, but it remains the case that an overwhelming majority of evangelicals continue to support Trump and his policies. Sure, they may have issues with his moral center, or lack thereof, but they're willing to overlook all this for the sake of political expediency, for promises of "religious freedom," and the hope of a judiciary stacked with conservative judges. This is because, at the end of the day, evangelicalism isn't really about personal values but, rather, social and political conversion and control.

Phelps reveals an inconvenient truth about the White Evangelical. Trump did not create the pathology. He is just their medium that is a reflection of them.

The Trump era, then, does not create a new problem for evangelicals and their image; it's simply casting a very bright light on what has always been there, at least for the past forty years or so. ... it's questionable the extent to which evangelicals ever held much moral authority in the first place. ... appealing to some "pure" form of the faith beyond its supposed political corruption—beyond the racism, xenophobia, nationalism, and the like that even critics of paper over—isn't the way to go.

Not only do such appeals represent little more than nostalgia-laden theological desires that have little to do with what goes on on the ground, but they also ignore the fact that the line between religion and politics is flimsy at best, if not entirely non-existent.

Evangelicalism, in its current manifestation, isn't a religion that has been corrupted by its entry into politics but is, rather, a social movement that works through a specific type of politics. The substance of that politics has been clearly on display for some time now. Trump and his evangelical allies didn't invent it; they only exacerbated it.

It is important that your Evangelical relatives and friends read this. It just may give them pause as they examine their morality. Maybe they will begin to see what the rest of the world sees. Maybe they will realize the irreparable damage they are doing to Christianity.

The Florida Constitution Revision Commission (CRC) voted to pass a proposal that would undermine public education in Florida and open the floodgates to unregulated charter schools supported by taxpayer dollars. Because the proposal also limits local school boards' ability to manage charter schools, it also limits the public's ability to vet and monitor charter schools to ensure they comply with the same standards and non-discrimination policies as all other public schools.

We need your help to stop this proposal from advancing. <u>Contact the CRC now and urge them to reject this dangerous proposal</u>. Thank you for standing with us in defense of Florida students.

The saw-tooth pattern reflects vegetation cycles in the northern hemisphere: CO₂ is taken out of the atmosphere by living plants during the April-September growing season, and released by dead plants in the rest of the year. The pattern is slightly offset by the opposite seasons in the southern hemisphere, but since the majority of the world's land, and the great majority of agricultural land, is in the north, the saw-tooth cycle is not over-ridden. This pattern has probably been unchanged as long as the continents have been in their present locations.

The saw-tooth pattern reveals an important example of the complex interworking of biological, chemical and geological cycles that define global metabolism. The planet's orbit and tilt cause seasons, which trigger cycles of plant growth and decay, which cause atmospheric CO₂ to rise and fall. While each of those cycles can be studied independently, they can only be fully understood as elements of the Earth as an integrated system.

Since 1958 the amplitude of the zigzag — the distance from high to low each year — has increased by as much as 50%. More CO₂ is being absorbed by forests and plants in spring and summer, and more is being released in fall and winter, but the change isn't balanced — the highs are increasing faster than the lows. Plants seem to be struggling to take in as much as possible. Other studies indicate that increased CO₂ intake helps plants such as corn to grow faster, but reduces the crop's nutritional value.

What the Keeling Curve shows, then, are two separate but connected rifts in Earth's metabolism. First, an increase in total CO₂ that breaks with at least 800,000 years of history. Second, increased CO2 is changing the way that plants absorb and emit CO₂, and that in turn is altering a seasonal cycle that has likely been unchanged for hundreds of millions of years.

In short, the Keeling Curve shows that Earth isn't just breathing, it is hyperventilating. No one knows what the long-term results might be.

In God We Trust?

Atheists of Florida continues contacting Florida School boards concerning our offer to supply the signs needed to meet the mandate the legislature passed that all schools display the state motto, In God We Trust., in every building used by the school board. We are offering to supply, at our expense, signs which meet the requirement, but also teach students about the first amendment and the diversity of gods (religions) in the United States. (The signs are pictured above and are also available at Free2Think.org) We have directly contacted 65 of the 67 county school boards to inform them of our offer. We attended the Pinellas County School Board meeting in April (the presentation is available for viewing at https://youtu.be/SDOVXSQZ7Y4) and will attend the Sarasota County School Board meeting in May.

To assist us with the project we ran a (not very scientific) survey asking what god(s), if any, people trust. While the survey doesn't officially close until April 30th, the results are pretty clear. We have, at the time of publication, received 431 responses. 45.9% of the responses say they trust no god. The Fly Spaghetti Monster received 35.7% of the vote, with Jesus receiving 14.6% and Thor getting 11.8%. We listed 23 gods (some with multiple names) and gave people a chance to add their own god, so we ended up with 56 gods. A few of the gods added were the Invisible Pink Unicorn, All when my period is late, and the extraterrestrial Spaghetti goddess.



Thinking Freely Speaking Out

Even after the *Bill of Rights* was law, some states continued to outlaw criticism of religion. In 1879, a Maryland law asserted:

"If any person, by writing or speaking, shall blaspheme or curse God, or shall write or utter any profane words of and concerning our Savior, Jesus Christ, or of and concerning the Trinity... shall be imprisoned not more than six months."

A famous American case involved P.T. Barnum before he became a circus tycoon. As a teen-ager, he started a weekly Connecticut newspaper, *The Herald of Freedom*, which denounced Calvinist "blue laws" against Sabbath work. His attack on church elders caused a libel prosecution that put him in jail for two months. Upon release, the budding showman staged a welcomehome parade for himself.

England's laws required all officeholders to swear a religious oath "on the true faith of a Christian." Freethinker Charles Bradlaugh, president of the Secular Society and publisher of a skeptic newspaper, was elected to Parliament in 1880, but refused to swear the oath. He was jailed briefly and expelled from the House of Commons, then won subsequent re-elections, and finally was seated in 1886. Previously, he and secular colleagues fought various blasphemy charges.

Today, many Western democracies are scuttling blasphemy laws – but Muslim lands still enforce them brutally.

The clash between free speech and blasphemy prosecution cannot be resolved. It ends only when religion fades so much that too few believers remain to be outraged by questioning. Witty British writer and Catholic apologist G.K. Chesterton wrote in 1905:
