

The American Humanist Association has worked with Senators James Lankford (R-OK) and Chris Coons (D-DE) to introduce a resolution which calls for the repeal of blasphemy laws worldwide. This resolution, S. Res. 647 encourages the President and the State Department to make the worldwide repeal of these laws a priority, while also opposing any attempts at the United Nations to support blasphemy laws. In many countries, Christians, Jews, Muslims, Hindus, nontheists, and other religious minorities are imprisoned, tortured, sentenced to death, and executed for blasphemy offenses. This resolution urges countries that still maintain such laws to repeal them and free the prisoners who were imprisoned for "blaspheming". Now that this resolution has been introduced, we need your help to ensure that it gets enough co-sponsors to pass Congress and be sent to the President's desk. Can you take a moment right now to ask your Senators to co-sponsor S. **Res. 647?**

In today's bitterly divided political climate, it's important to note that both Republicans and Democrats are supporting this legislation. That's because the issue of religious freedom is something that all Americans can support.

Declaring a climate emergency

Comparing WWII to climate change, we should first acknowledge that once again, the issue is not the evidence of the threat. That is clear and accepted – in fact with hindsight it will be seen as blindingly obvious. What is relatively new is that scientists and experts are increasingly acknowledging that nothing less than a massive global mobilization on a WWII scale is required to address the catastrophic risks posed.

Professor Hans Joachim Schellnhuber, head of the Potsdam Institute for Climate Impact Research, and a senior advisor to Pope Francis, German Chancellor Angela Merkel and the European Union recently argued that "Climate change is now reaching the end-game, where very soon humanity must choose between taking unprecedented action, or accepting that it has been left too late and bear the consequences."

All around us examples of what these consequences might be are increasingly tangible. Whether it be wild fires in northern Sweden, refugee crises, extreme ice melt in the Arctic, submerged airports in Japan or severe droughts, people are feeling climate change live.

My key argument is that this process – identified threats, resistance and avoidance, stronger and stronger evidence, acceptance of crisis and then dramatic response - is pretty much how these things always unfold. And so it will most likely be on climate change.

Many argue we need a Churchill to lead us, that only a strong leader can take charge in a crisis and show us the way forward. Or maybe we need a climate "Pearl Harbor" – a major single event. This is not how systems usually change, but especially not in a globalized and connected world. Yes, we need leadership and across all sections of society. But the "Churchill's" emerge from a context and the context shift we need is to accept we have a crisis. Critically, this acceptance is a distributed social phenomenon, not a technical question of science or evidence.

This brings me back to Darebin in Melbourne. This local council looked rationally at what the science told them that we face a crisis and the only logical response is to declare a climate emergency. And so they did. In consultation with their community, they then developed the Darebin Climate Emergency Plan.

Why is this significant? Because this is how systems change. Ideas take hold and spread. Darebin has since been followed in the US with a small but growing list of elected bodies in regions and cities also declaring a climate emergency. First came Montgomery County, Maryland, since joined by Richmond, Berkeley and Los Angeles in California, and Hoboken, New Jersey. This is not emerging spontaneously, but through active organizing by groups dedicated to the task like The Climate Mobilization.

Yes, it's frustrating that these things take time. Therefore, knowing we can still "win" is key. Towards this end I co-wrote nearly 10 years ago a journal paper, The One Degree War Plan, with Professor Jorgen Randers, showing how achieving 1 degree of warming was surprisingly realistic with a WWII style mobilization. Recently along the same lines, The Climate Mobilization developed a "Victory Plan" to show what a WWII style economic mobilization across the USA could look like.

So on the surface, Darebin Council inviting a group of experts like myself to suburban Melbourne to discuss what a climate emergency means might not seem much. But it is a crucial part of a process whereby we first normalize the idea that we face an existential crisis. Next we will come to accept that the only rational response is a WWII -like economic mobilization to eliminate global net carbon dioxide emissions within a decade or so.

Find this hard to imagine? It is. But as we learnt from Churchill in 1940, when we shift our thinking to "what is necessary", what we can achieve is quite extraordinary. Or as Nelson Mandela said: "It always seems impossible, until it's done."



Strangely, the election of Donald Trump to the Presidency of the United States, as a symptom of a growing global epidemic of reactionary conservatism, puts one sobering possibility into stark relief.



CFI in Action: Secular Rescue

CFI is proud to operate Secular Rescue, a program that has saved more than fifty-five secularists, atheists, and nonbelievers from persecution and violence. In many countries, expressions of nonbelief are punished by government repression, vigilante violence, or both. In April 2013, secular activist Avijit Roy requested CFI's assistance to oppose the imprisonment of four secular bloggers in Bangladesh who made statements critical of religion's role in government. CFI quickly organized efforts that contributed to their release.

Two years later, Roy was murdered by religious extremists. Soon after, CFI created Secular Rescue in response to the escalating danger to secularists in Bangladesh and other countries. Secular Rescue provides funding, advice, government liaison, and logistical support to assist nonbelievers in relocating to relative safety, which can often only be found outside their country of residence.



Center for Inquiry (CFI) is a 501(c)(3) charitable nonprofit organization. Its mission is to foster a secular society based on reason, science, freedom of inquiry, and humanist values. CFI's vision is a world in which evidence, science, and compassion—rather than superstition, pseudoscience, or prejudice—guide public policy.

What Does CFI Do?

CFI is a dynamic organization whose mission touches on a wide range of critical issues. Here are some of the ways that we advance our mission:

- We educate policymakers on legislation and policy that are relevant to our mission.
- We initiate strategic litigation and produce amicus briefs on important church-state separation and science cases.
- Our Teacher Institute for Evolutionary Science (TIES) hosts workshops across the U.S. to provide tools for middle school teachers to effectively teach evolution and respond to its critics. TIES will host more than forty workshops in 2018.
- Our full-time professional librarian maintains a freethought library in Buffalo, New York, with more than 72,000 items, including rare books and periodicals held nowhere else in the world.
- We publish two bimonthly magazines: *Free Inquiry*, a journal of secular humanist thought, and *Skeptical Inquirer*, the magazine for science and reason, with a combined total of more than 26,100 subscribers.
- We operate the Robert Green Ingersoll Birthplace Museum in New York's Finger Lakes region to honor the legacy of late nineteenth century America's foremost orator, political speechmaker, and champion of freethought.
- Our regional branches host dozens of events, briefings, and demonstrations across the country.
- We train and support secular celebrants to perform weddings, memorials, and other ceremonies that mark life's great milestones.
- We support and protect the rights of nonbelievers and religiously unaffiliated individuals in the United States and around the world.

Why Does CFI Advocate for Science and Secular Values?

While it may not seem obvious that evidence and compassion have anything to do with each other, CFI believes that these values are deeply interdependent.

CFI believes that government best serves its citizens when public policy is rooted in evidence: objective facts that individuals can confirm without reference to their personal experience. Personal experience can be informative and valuable, but to ensure that policy broadly improves human welfare and respects the rights of every individual, our policy proposals should appeal to evidence that can be confirmed even by those who disagree with us on many issues.

Although science is imperfect in practice, the scientific method is the most useful tool ever discovered for developing a more accurate understanding of our world. In the last 400 years, the scientific revolution has led to an astonishing and unprecedented acceleration of human welfare—in health, security, longevity, freedom, opportunity, and knowledge. CFI honors this rich legacy of open inquiry by supporting policies that protect the integrity of scientific findings in law and policy from political or religious influence.

CFI prioritizes opposition to policies that harm individuals on the basis of disproven ideas. Ideas such as hostility to LGBTQ rights have historical roots in religious instructions that are not supported by evidence.


Other harmful policy ideas originate from contemporary pseudoscience. For example, many claims about "alternative medicine" are disproven by science. Possibly the most egregious of these is homeopathy, a billion-dollar industry based on the disproven eighteenth-century theory that when diluted to virtually nonexistent concentrations, toxic substances transfer invisible healing properties to ordinary water molecules. CFI has filed suit against CVS Health, the largest retail pharmacy chain in the United States, for fraudulently marketing homeopathic products in the District of Columbia.

Why is Freedom of Religion Important to Nonbelievers?

Freedom of religion includes both the right to choose one's religion *and* the right to choose no religion at all. The Supreme Court has upheld this right in numerous decisions. For example, in *Welsh v. United States*, the Court ruled that the Constitution required that conscientious objector status be open to non-religious individuals as well as religious individuals. 






If only More Atheists Robbed Banks by Aaron Lebaron (Special to the Freethought News)

So I'm sitting on my cell bunk, poring over a small stack of computer printouts for the stats to fact-check a book I'm writing, when a random, unrelated headline catches my eye. A Federal court, the headline proclaims, has granted humanists and other nontheist inmates the right to get together and discuss their views--a privilege long since reserved for those inmates who were members of a traditional religious congregation.

This may not sound like much, but for me, it was huge. After nearly a quarter century isolated from my fellow nontheists due to my incarceration--including three years in solitary and one in a CERESO in the Yucatan--I was eager to escape the echo chamber of my own mind. After decades watching from the sidelines as religiously affiliated inmates gather each week to share their views and celebrate their beliefs, I could hardly believe our chance had arrived.

That said, I couldn't pop the champagne cork just yet. As far as I could tell, no one around here was aware of the ruling. And if the theists knew, they weren't tellin'. So I figured it was up to me to spread the good news. After all, there couldn't be more than a dozen or so nontheists here. And all within a quarter mile radius. How hard could it be?

You see, in a prison yard environment, the lone nontheist tends to keep a low profile. They tend to go along to get along. And they often avoid taking firm positions involving politics or religion--or rather, the lack thereof. And they avoid saying things, such as the "A-word" (atheist) which might ruffle theist feathers. So when I ask them to put all that aside to form a nontheist group, I'm asking a lot.

Moreover, I should have known that the theist hordes were not about to sit back and allow us godless heathens to just waltz on in and upset their centuries-old chapel monopoly cart without a fight. What I could not have known is that in the time it would take us to decide on how we might go about spreading the good news about the court's decision, the news of us godless heathens' blasphemous designs to desecrate the Lord's sanctuary with our unholy presence had gone viral--ruffling many a theist feather along the way. And it didn't take long for the theists to strike back. First came the all-out charm offensive: Any inmate expressing interest in the literature Emily Newman from AHA sent us, or who was caught associating with me got the red carpet treatment. Nontheists--the theist dirt of a few weeks ago---spontaneously morphed into theist quasi-royalty and began enjoying the luxury of VIP status they had never experienced before. They, and I, were assured there was no need for a nontheist study group since we were all welcome to attend their (religious) services together with them. And they even promised not to hold our godless heathenism against us. It would fall on me to deliver the bad news to our gracious would-be hosts: Thanks...but no thanks. And that's when I became persona non grata.

As a result, to date, some two months after I first learned of the court's ruling, I guesstimate that fewer than 20% of the nontheist inmate population are even aware we now have equal rights to access the once exclusive theist domain. In fact, I still don't even know how many nontheists there are in the institution--so I have no way of determining whether there are enough of us to sustain a nontheist study group.

To be fair, however, I suspect my biggest obstacle to forming a nontheist study group may have nothing to do with theist shenanigans--or theist anything for that matter. I'd hate to be the bearer of bad news, but us nontheists may simply not have what it takes to sustain adequate representation among the inmate population. At the heart of the problem is our stubborn insistence on examining the facts before making life-altering decisions.

You see, someone who refuses to bet everything on the heartwarming and fuzzy, if unverifiable, promises of religion is unlikely to dispense with this fact verification habit in order to throw it all away in pursuit of the ephemeral lure of easy money from criminal activity. Besides, sustaining the criminal mindset requires a form of logic, or rather, a logic-leaping capacity, which the nontheist may lack. It requires a pair of de-facto rose-colored glasses with the capacity to deflect or filter out evidence of an avalanche of undesirable consequences sliding down the slope of life in one's direction.

This may go a long way toward explaining why some twenty of every one thousand Americans are atheists-yet as few as one in one thousand prison inmates self identify as atheist.

Why? There just aren't enough nontheists out there robbing banks and distributing controlled substances on the hazy notion that this is a rational means of acquiring cash. In other words, at the root of my troubles forming a prison nontheist group is that us nontheists just aren't filling prison cells for much the same reason we aren't filling the pews at that little white church down the street: We obstinately insist on inspecting drifting morsels we may encounter in the sea of life--no matter how tasty--for sharp, curved little objects tied to a string before we bite--or swallow--the bait.

As a result, while the theists claim the bragging rights to the numbers to sustain 31 separate study groups, involving some twenty different religions--including several numbering in the hundreds--us nontheists are relegated to scraping the bottom of the barrel in the hopes of cobbling together one small study group. The sad--or happy-- truth is that prison is likely to remain a lonely place for nontheists into the foreseeable future. So, okay, show of hands--any volunteers to rob a bank so as to help alleviate the chronic under-representation of nontheists in the prison population? No? You see what I mean? They just won't take the bait.

Religious Liberty?

The Department of Justice is establishing a "religious liberty task force." The announcement follows remarks made by Attorney General Jeff Sessions at the Justice Department's religious liberty summit. In his speech, Sessions said; "In short, we have not only the freedom to worshipbut the right to exercise our faith. The Constitution's protections don't end at the parish parking lot nor can our freedoms be confined to our basements. Religious Americans are no longer an afterthought."

"This is a religious privilege task force - plain and simple. According to Attorney General Sessions, this task force is going to take its marching orders from the Justice Department's <u>Memorandum on Religious</u> <u>Liberty</u>. That Memorandum lays out the entire political agenda of the religious right and flips the entire notion of 'religious liberty' on its head by instructing federal agencies to treat religious belief as an incontestable get-out-of-jail -free card."

"If fully implemented, the Memorandum would give individuals, organizations, and for-profit corporations that claim a religious affiliation an exemption from a whole swath of federal, state, and local laws. When this Memorandum was announced, we called it a '<u>declaration of war</u>' against the LGBTQ community, women, nontheists, and religious minorities. The task force Sessions' announced today will be his foot soldiers in the war against the wall of separation between church and state."

The new effort seeks to funnel taxpayer money <u>directly to</u> religious institutions."

Do you vote-by-mail or are you considering voting-by-mail?

In our new report <u>Vote-By-Mail Ballots Cast in Florida</u>, we found that vote-by-mail ballots cast in the 2012 and 2016 general election had a higher rejection rate than votes cast at assigned precincts on Election Day and at early voting sites. We also found that younger voters and racial and ethnic minority voters were much more likely to cast mail ballots that were rejected and were less likely to have their ballots cured. <u>You should read our new report »</u>

We want to empower you with the tools you need to ensure your ballot counts. Find <u>step-by-step instructions on our</u> <u>website</u> that describe how to make sure your vote-by-mail ballot is counted.

We have consulted with County Supervisors of Election and state elections officials at the Department of State and are

Thinking Freely Speaking Out



You may have heard the acronym VUCA before. It stands for volatility, uncertainty, complexity and ambiguity. It's used in a business context to describe the reality of work. Which is that - things happen. If I have a professional relationship with someone – the thing that gets us through the volatility and

ambiguity and to work through the complexity – is having clarity on what it is we are trying to accomplish. Who is responsible for what etc. To me – clarity is what helps makes getting through VUCA doable. It's what reduces my stress. To me, this is what professionalism is. It's about being professional enough to help increase clarity so that the team can deal with the volatility and complexity and ambiguity as a team.Let me give you an example of what lacking clarity leads to.

I get booked a lot to give talks. In order to give a talk - I need information.

Like - WHEN is this talk going to take place. WHERE is this talk and HOW am I going to get there. WHAT exactly do you want me to talk about? WHY do you want me to talk about it?

These are all reasonable questions and without answers to them - I can't give someone my time. When people book me - I expect clarity on these questions. When I don't get that clarify - I can't help anyone or participate in the meeting, or even if I do - I can't support the objectives of the meeting if I don't know what they are. Providing me with this information - so that I can do my job - despite the unknowns - is what it means to be professional.

When I get a contract, the first thing I do after winning a contract, is call the customer and ask questions and answer questions so that - there is clarity between us about expectations, roles, duties etc.

Things happen. A Professional works to make sure VUCA isn't going to negatively effect us – and if it does, that we have the trust we need to overcome it. My courses are online at: <u>https://humanistlearning.com</u>
